INAUGURATION OF THE P.G. DIPLOMA COURSE IN BOOK PUBLISHING [28 February 2005]

Prof. Satyasadhan Chakraborty, Hon'ble Minister in Charge of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal formally inaugurated the P.G. Diploma Course in Book Publishing (PGDBP) at Darbhanga Hall, University of Calcutta, College Street campus. Prof. Asis Kumar Banerjee, Vice Chancellor, Calcutta University, presided over the function. Among the speakers were Prof. Suranjan Das, Pro-Vice Chancellor (Academic Affairs), Prof. Tapan Kumar Mukherjee, Pro-Vice Chancellor (B A & F), Prof Ujjwal Kumar Basu, Registrar, Dr. S N Bera, Coordinator, PGDBP and Dr. Biplab Chakrabarti, Member, PGDBP. Teachers of different departments of the University and senior publishers were present at the function. The PGDBP was instituted by the University as a self-finance one-year course, in collaboration with the Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Kolkata.

FIRST C U--GUILD MoU [28 February 2005]

On 28 February 2005, the University of Calcutta and the Publishers & Booksellers Guild signed a Memorandum of Understanding in the matter of running the P.G. Diploma Course in Book Publishing. Prof Ujjwal Kumar Basu, Registrar, Calcutta University and Mr. Tridib Kumar Chatterjee, Hony. General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild signed the MoU on behalf of respective institutions in presence of the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Asis Kumar Banerjee. The ceremony was held at the Vice Chancellor's Office Room. The witnesses of the MoU were Dr. S N Bera, Coordinator, PGDBP and Dr. Biplab Chakrabarti , Member, PGDBP on behalf of the University and Mr Kalyan Shah, President and Mr. Tapas Saha, Joint Secretary on behalf of the Guild.

It may be noted in this respect that after a series of discussions with the Guild officials for over three and a half months, the University finally decided in September 2004 to introduce the diploma course in book publishing under self-finance mode. On 29 September 2004 Prof. Asis Kumar Banerjee, Vice Chancellor, Calcutta University ordered constitution of the first Advisory Committee of the course with the following members-

CSBP-NBT JOINT SEMINAR ON KAZI NAZRUL ISLAM [24 May 2008]

National Book Trust of India, in collaboration with the Centre for Studies in Book Publishing, chose Chandramukhi-Kadambini Sabhagriha, the Calcutta University Central Library auditorium, as the venue to launch a new title in Bengali, *Kazi Nazrul Islam: Nirbachita Rachana Sangraha* (Collected Works of Kazi Nazrul Islam). The book is edited by Mr. Azharuddin Khan, an eminent expert on Nazrul. The event took place on 24 May 2008. Prof. Arun Kumar Bose, retired professor of Rabindra Bharati University, chaired the event.

Among the other dignitaries present, apart from the editor of the volume, were Mr. Sanat Chattopadhyay, Secretary, Paschimbanga Bangla Akademi, Dr. Biplab Chakrabarti, Reader, Department of Library and Information Sciences, and Prof. Biswanath Roy, Department of Bengali.

FIRST CONDENSED COURSE ON BOOK PUBLISHING [31 October--7 November 2008]

The 7-day Condensed Course on Book Publishing (CCBP) was organised by the CSBP and the Publishers & Booksellers Guild in collaboration with Sahitya Akademi from 31 October to 7 November 2008. The course, first of its kind was designed to serve emerging and intermediate publishing professionals of West Bengal and some other adjoining states. The minimum qualification for joining the course was graduation in any discipline. But it was relaxable for those who were already in the profession.

The inauguration ceremony of the programme took place at the Darbhanga Hall of the University on 31 October 2008. Eminent author, Mr. Sunil Gangopadhyay, noted literateur and President, Sahitya Academy, lighted the inaugural lamp. Mr. Gangopadhyay in his brief speech pointed out the importance of such professional training course, especially when printed books are under pressure. Prof. Sudarshan Roy Chowdhury, Hon'ble Minister-in-Charge, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, graced the occasion as the Guest-in-Chief. Prof. Chowdhury appreciated the decision to conduct the course and hoped that it would help the publishing industry. Prof Suranjan Das, Vice Chancellor of the University of Calcutta presided over the session. He observed that in the context of globalization and western cultural hegemony, an indigenous premium quality book production must be built up for educating the children of the country. Prof. Rita Sinha, Dean of the Faculty Council for the P.G. Studies in Education, Journalism & Library Science, Mr. Tridib Kr. Chatterjee, General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Dr. S N Bera, Director, CSBP, Dr. Biplab Chakrabarti, Member, CSBP Advisory Committee, Prof. Biswanath Roy, Member, CSBP Advisory Committee and Prof. Basab Choudhuri, Registrar also spoke on the occasion.

CSBP- GUILD JOINT SEMINAR AT THE 33RD KOLKATA BOOK FAIR [31 January- 6 February 2009]

The Centre for Studies in Book Publishing and the Publishers & Booksellers Guild organized jointly a number of seminars at the 33rd Kolkata Book Fair, Milan Mela Ground.

Mr. Arya Ghosh was moderator.

Ms. Avril Gray, Programme Leader, School of Creative Industries, Napier University, interacted with the faculty and students of the Centre for Studies in Book Publishing, Calcutta University, at the International Rights Hall on 1 February to discuss the needs and possibilities of workable partnerships in the field of publishing studies and training within the academia.

Gray was introduced to the audience by Ms. Sujata Sen, Director, East India, British Council, and felicitated by Edinburgh-based, Kolkata-born scholar and writer Dr. Basabi Fraser. Mr. Arya Ghosh, CSBP, moderated the programme. Prof. S. N. Bera, Director, CSBP, also took part in the deliberation. In the course of the interaction, Ms. Avril Gray spoke at length on the activities of the School of Creative Industries at Napier University where publishing is a highly sought for curriculum subject for the last 40 years.

The emphasis of the curriculum at Napier is on intense practical and placement. Prof Bera, on the other hand, threw light on the needs and demands of the Indian Publishing Industry and the priorities of the students. The key words that did the rounds were 'passion' and 'skill'. The areas of collaboration should be carefully outlined, it was agreed.

The discussion was followed by a question-answer session where the students were most vocal. The questions were on eligibility and fees structure of such courses and the nature of training. The students proved at least one point, namely, Kolkata never lacks in passion.

During the programme, Mr. Hiren Chattopadhyay released a poetry anthology, *Pratham Kheya*, by Dr. Samarendra Nath Ghosh, a student of PGDBP.

5 February 2009: Topic: 'Emerging Translation Economy: Market Potentials in Indian Publishing'. Venue: AC HALL /3.15pm-5.15pm. Speakers: Prof. Jayati Ghosh, Member, National Knowledge Commission, Mr Biman Basu, Working President, Bangia Shakhharata Prasar Samity and Chairman, Left Front, Mr Prabir Majumdar, Guild Member and Director, Dev Sahitya Kutir Pvt. Ltd., Prof Bibhuti Pattanaik, eminent writer from Bhubaneshwar. Dr. Ram Kumar Mukhopadhyay, Regional Secretary, Sahitya Akademi, moderated the programme. Director of CSBP, Prof. S.N. Bera introduced the speakers. The General Secretary of the Guild, Mr. Tridib Chatterjee was also present on the dais and commented on the relevance of the topic.

Prof. Jayati Ghosh and Mr. Biman Basu discussed the objectives of the National Translation Mission, proposed by the National Knowledge Commission.

Reflecting on his own experience in literacy drive movement, Mr. Biman Basu said, "Translation is important for the purpose of diffusion of knowledge. It applies not only to West Bengal but the whole of India since we are a multilingual country with a large population."

Citing the example of 2% of the university graduates in China being employed by the translation industry, Prof. Ghosh pointed out, "Indian youths will benefit from integrated translation projects in Indian regional languages as it would generate employment. Hence the formulaic term translation economy."

Dr. Pattanaik stated, "The need of the hour is to set up a translation guild for quality translation since India is the third largest publisher in English after US and UK."

"Since publishers cannot afford to overlook financial viability completely, well-trained translators are needed for ensuring quality," said Mr. Prabir Majumdar, stressing the need for market-ready training for budding translators.

Many eminent academicians, translators, institutional officials and students of book publishing attended the seminar.

Speakers - James McCall, Deputy Director, Stirling Centre for International Publishing and Communication, University of Stirling, Scotland, Ms. Sujata Sen Director, British Council, East India. Prof. S N Bera also spoke on this occasion. Mr. Arya Ghosh was moderator.

Prof. James McCall, Deputy Director, Stirling Centre for International Publishing and Communication, Stirling University, Scotland, met the students of PGDBP over an interesting interactive session during the book fair on the same day at the International Rights Hall and threw light on the current trends in international publishing and also the course structure and activities of his centre. Prof McCall was impressed by the zeal of the students which he felt was reflected in their questions at the end of the talk.

Prof McCall was introduced to the audience by Ms. Sujata Sen, Director, East India, British Council. Mr. Arya Ghosh, CSBP, moderated the programme.

At another event later in the city (Burns Supper) Prof. McCall also met with Prof. S.N.Bera to discuss issues related to a functional collaboration between the two universities in the field of book publishing studies. British Council, Kolkata, facilitated the meeting.

6 February 2009: Topic: 'Book Publishing Ethics: Exchange of Views'. Venue: AC Hall/5-45pm- 6.45pm. Speakers - Mr. Tridib Kr. Chatterjee, Dr. Soharab Hossain, Mr. Sisir Bindu Chowdhury, Prof. S N Bera, Mr. Subhabrata Deb, Prof. Anis Deb (Moderator). The house adopted the 'Charter of Book Publishing Ethics' presented by Prof. S. N. Bera, Director CSBP. The norms of professional conduct enunciated in the charter mainly dealt with important issues like upholding basic human rights, respecting copyrights, checking plagiarism, fighting piracy, obscenity and vulgarity, special care for children's literature, caution against defamatory writings, communal harmony and secular values, gender fairness, inclusive development, and promoting professionalism.

Professor S. N. Bera, Director CSBP, Calcutta University proposed a Charter of Book Publishing Ethics at the 33rd International Kolkata Book Fair on 6 February. The eminent panelists at the AC Hall included Mr. Subhobroto Dey, Secretary, Tripura Publishers Guild, Mr Sisir Bindu Chowdhury, Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Association of Bengal, Mr. Tridib Kumar Chatterjee, General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Dr. Soharab Hossain, President, West Bengal Madrasah Education Board. Prof. Anis Deb, eminent writer and professor of Calcutta University, moderated the discussion.

Codification of ethical guidelines requires consensus of all the stake holders, such as, publishers, printers, authors, readers and the general public to be effective. Ethical practices evolve through consensus and understanding. Professional training courses like the one-year Postgraduate Diploma Course in Book Publishing (PGDBP) run by CSBP in partnership with the Guild helps in

encouraging the professionals involved in the book-publishing industry to uphold ethical values by self-regulation with the objective to improve its standards and contribute to social development.

Full text of the proposed charter is given below--

THE CSBP CHARTER OF BOOK PUBLISHING ETHICS

Preface

Every profession functions by certain norms of self regulation with the objective to improve its standards and to contribute to the society and social development. Ethical standards in book publishing are rooted in the public interest. Book publishing is a noble profession and the business has expanded its influence over the years. The publishing community is expected to respect voluntarily certain norms of professional conduct. Codification of its work ethics is now an imperative need.

The charter may help serve public interest and benefit all the stake holders, such as, publishers, printers, authors, readers and general public alike.

The norms of professional conduct enunciated below may help the book publishers self-regulate their conduct –

Upholding Basic Human Rights: The right to freedom of publishing is a basic human right to be upheld uncompromisingly.

Respecting Copy Rights: Book publishers shall respect copyrights and the terms of copyright agreements.

Checking Plagiarism: Book publishers shall treat plagiarism or the unacknowledged reproduction of other people's work as an offence.

Fighting Piracy: Book publishers owe a special responsibility in fighting and preventing piracy of books.

Fair Business Practice: Book publishers shall act with fairness and transparency in business practices.

Obscenity and Vulgarity to be Eschewed: Book publishers shall eschew anything which is obscene, vulgar, indecent or offensive to good taste.

Special Care for Children's Literature: Book publishers shall demonstrate special responsibility in respecting the rights of children while producing children's literature.

Caution Against Defamatory Writings: Book publishers shall not publish anything which is manifestly defamatory or libelous against any individual/organization.

Communal Harmony and Secular Values: Book publishers owe a special responsibility in promoting communal peace, amity and secular values.

Gender Fairness: Book publishers shall contribute towards eliminating gender bias and achieving gender equality.

Inclusive Development: Book publishing is to contribute to inclusive and sustainable socio-cultural development and help enhance people's capacity to access to newer branches of knowledge.

Maintaining Healthy Relations: Book publishers shall work utmost to maintain and enhance healthy relations among all members of publishing community including authors, artists and consumers.

Promoting Professionalism: Book publishers shall do their best to encourage professionalism and promote formal training in book publishing.

NAPIER UNIVERSITY PROPOSES COLLABORATION

On 3 February 2009, Dr. Ms. Avril Gray's (Programme Leader, School of Creative Industries, Napier University, Scotland) called on Prof. Suranjan Das, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor at the office of the Vice Chancellor at 12-30 pm. Discussion was held on the possibility of cooperation between the CSBP and Napier University to start a 4-semester MA course in Book Publishing and other programmes such as students' and faculty exchange, research, seminars, etc. The existing course structures, fees, and examination systems of both the universities in the relevant streams were discussed.

The stipulations of the University Grants Commission were explained by the Vice Chancellor. But the most important issue that emerged during the discussion was the sponsorship/funding of the students from India to enable them bear the expenses of study for a degree at Napier. The discussion was very positive and the mood was upbeat on both sides of the table and both agreed on principle to examine the issues further and work out a detailed plan if possible and keep each other informed. The meeting ended with exchange of information, materials and souvenirs.

Dr Bashabi Fraser of the School of Creative Industries, Napier University, Ms Sujata Sen, Director, British Council, Kolkata, Prof. S.N.Bera, Director CSBP, Prof. Biplab Chakrabarti, Member, CSBP Advisory Committee and Mr. Arya Ghosh, resource person of the PGDBP course, were present and took part in the discussion.

THIRD C U--GUILD MoU [3 March 2009]

The University–Guild MoU was renewed on 3 March 2009 in presence of Prof Suranjan Das, Vice Chancellor. Prof Basab Choudhuri, Registrar signed on behalf of the University and Mr. Tridib Kumar Chatterjee on behalf of the Guild. Witnesses were Dr. S N Bera and Dr. Biplab Chakrabarti on behalf of the University and Mr. Jayant Manaktala, Vice President and Mr. Suprakash Basu, Joint Secretary on Guild's behalf.

SEMINAR ON 'DEROZIO AND HIS READING HABITS' [18 March 2009]

The CSBP and the Department of Bengali Language & Literature in collaboration with Derozio Commemoration Committee organized a seminar on 'Derozio and His Reading Habits' on 18 March 2009 at Room No. 10, Asutosh Building, C U College Street Campus on the occasion of the bicentenary of Henry Louis Vivian Derozio's birth. Prof. Ramkrishna Bhattacharya was the speaker. Prof. Biswanath Roy was on the chair. Prof. Biplab Chakraborti, Prof. Sanat Naskar and Dr. Saktisadhan Mukherjee also spoke on the occasion.

WORKSHOP ON 'PROBLEMS OF SMALL PUBLISHERS' [4 June 2009]

The Centre for Studies in Book Publishing organized a workshop on 'Problems of Small Publishers' jointly with the Publishers & Booksellers Guild and in collaboration with the Publishers & Booksellers Association of Bengal at Chandramukhi - Kadambini Sabhagriha on 4 June 2009. In this occasion, most of the speakers were practising text-book publishers – Mr. Chitta Singha Roy, Mr. Himangshu Bandopadhyay, Mr. Nirmalendu Das, Mr. Rabindranath Basu, Mr. Bulbul Saha and Mr. Sribindu Bhattacharya. Mr. Sishirbindu Chowdhury, General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Association of Bengal delivered the vote of thanks.

This session covered extensive areas like trade securities for the small publishers, advertisement, publicity, professional training, co-operative formation, competitive pricing, cost-effective production techniques with other cost reducing measures, market expansion, investment in producing better quality text-book and fixing competitive standards. The possible role that the government could play in determining or fixing the price of the raw materials used in printing and assigning the small publishers the responsibility of publishing text-books were also discussed.

SECOND BENGAL BOOK PUBLISHING LECTURE [29 July 2009]

Mr. S K Ghai delivered the Second Bengal Book Publishing Lecture 2009 on a very important topic: 'Indian Books and Publishing Services for the World Market'. The lecture, instituted by the Centre for Studies in Book Publishing, was organized jointly with the Publishers & Booksellers Guild on 29 July 2009 at Chandramukhi-Kadambini Sabhagriha, College Street Campus.

Mr. Ghai hardly needs any introduction before the publishing community across India. Chairman cum Managing Director, Sterling Publishers (P) Ltd, Mr. Ghai is now Chairman of the Books, Publications and Printing Panel of CAPEXIL and Chairman of the Copyright Council of the Federation of Indian Publishers (FIP). He has always been a well-wisher of the CSBP. Mr. Ghai in his lecture drew the attention of the Indian publishing fraternity to the tremendous opportunities of trade in the emergent scenario of book exports in the liberalization era.

Prof. S N Bera, Director, CSBP presided over the function and delivered the welcome address. Mr. Tridib Kr. Chatterjee, Hony General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild gave introductory address. Prof. Basab Chaudhuri, CU Registrar graced the occasion as the Guest-in-Chief.

Dr Biplab Chakrabarti, member of the CSBP Advisory Committee delivered the valedictory speech. The presence of the Chairman of Book and Printing Division of CAPEXIL added dignity to the entire occasion. The message that has come out from this occasion is that there are enough export opportunities to the Indian publishers. Job opportunities in this profession are also increasing every day, opined the experts.

The books exhibited in this fair covered a wide range of genre – both fictions and non-fictions: novels, poetry books, drama, science fiction, historical, scientific and political documents, travelogues, etc. One of the main attractions of this exhibition was books published in Kakborok, a dialect of Tripura, and drew attention of avid visitors.

In conclusion, it can be said that the bookfair was indeed a successful event. A huge number of footfalls and sale of considerable amount everyday bespoke the organizers' feat. The success, in turn, foretold the onset of a remarkable journey.

NBT-CSBP JOINT PROGRAMME: 'PUBLISHERS' MEET' [29 October 2011]

Inauguration

Prof. Biplab Chakraborti, Joint Coordinator, PGDBPS; Prof. S N Bera, Director, CSBP, Mr. Suprokash Basu, President, Publishers and Booksellers Guild and Mr Sudhangshu Dey, Joint Secretary, Guild witnessed the grand event. The MoU would remain valid for a period of five years from the date of signing and may be extended further with the consent of both the parties.

CU-NBT MoU SIGNED [19 June 2012]

The historic Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the University of Calcutta and National Book Trust (NBT) was signed in presence of Prof. Suranjan Das, Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dhrubajyoti Chattopadhyay, Pro-Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Mr. M A Sikandar, Director of NBT on 19 June 2012 at the Syndicate Room of the University. The MoU was signed on behalf of the NBT by Mr. Sikandar and Registrar Prof. Basab Chaudhuri for Calcutta University. Those who signed as witnesses were: Prof. Biplab Chakraborti and Prof. Dhrubaranjan Dandapat, Joint Coordinators, P G Diploma in Book Publishing Studies for the University and Mr. Sumit Bhattacharjee, Assistant Director and Mr. Sayabur Rehman, Regional Manager (Eastern Regional Office) for the NBT. Among the other dignitaries present were: Prof. S N Bera Director, Centre for Studies in Book Publishing; Mr. Tridib Chatterjee, Hony. General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Kolkata, Mr. Sudhangshu Dey, President, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Kolkata and Mr. Raju Barman, Joint Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Kolkata.

The CSBP, the first of its kind in India, offers the PGDBPS, a one-year full time evening course covering every aspect of book publishing. The syllabus caters to the industry demands by generating well-trained, market-ready professionals every year, who have appropriate academic competence, adequate skill and attitude to handle different areas of publishing, editing, production, design and marketing.

The MoU mentions that from now onwards the NBT would bear the cost of honorarium for the resource persons/ guest faculties, cooperate in providing the students with facilities for internship/hands-on training, bear the cost of preparation and printing of study materials, etc. Besides providing infrastructure facilities, the NBT would also attempt its best to publicize the course. Short-term training programmes on various specialized aspects of book publishing would also be sponsored.

With the collaboration of NBT as a new partner, opportunities would be opened for the students of this course. This attempt would immensely benefit the book publishing community too. NBT, established in 1957, is an autonomous organization under

the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Being a highly professional multilingual publishing house, its role is to play as the nodal body for the promotion of Indian books and for the dissemination of book culture in India. At the end of the programme, Prof. Suranjan Das, Vice Chancellor, Mr. M A Sikandar and Mr. Tridib Kumar Chatterjee attended a press conference at the same venue.

Prof. Das expressed that the MoU would strengthen further the postgraduate diploma course in book publishing studies. "We may think of starting a full-time course if we get such assistance. We will write to the state government too for similar assistance so that we may make this course popular which will help the publishing sector", he said. "The course would be tailor made to suit the requirements of the industry. We will have both English and Bengali curriculum that would prepare young editors to take on the job at the end of the course. Apart from the university faculty, we could also have publishers to help take classes. We would also involve publishers in framing the curricula," said the CU Vice Chancellor.
