Regulation for Three Year Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) Course under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)-2018 of the Kolkata Police Law Institute (KPLI) affiliated to the University of Calcutta

The Regulation for Three Year LL.B. Course under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)-2018 of the Kolkata Police Law Institute (KPLI) affiliated to the University of Calcutta to be introduced with effect from academic Session 2018-2019 in continuation of Notification No. CSR/54/16 and Notification No. CSR/21/17 provides the following:

#### (A) GRADING SYSTEM AND CONVERSION OF PERCENTAGE INTO GRADE(S)

The following formula shall be applied for conversion of the percentage(s) to Grades and computing Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for Three Year LL.B. Course of the Kolkata Police Law Institute (KPLI) affiliated to the University of Calcutta.

(i) The marks secured by the students shall be converted to the Grades as Mentioned below:

- (ii) Letter Grade/Grade Point: It indicates the performance of a student in a paper/course described as Letter Grade or Grade Point as mentioned above. The candidate shall declared as Fail in all the paper in which he/she obtains less than 30% marks i.e. Letter Grade "F/AB" and Grade point 0.
- (iii) **Credit Points:** Credit points are obtained by multiplying credits in a course with grade points i.e. Credit point = Number of Credits in a Course x Grade point.

(iv) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): The SGPA indicates the performance of a candidate in a given Semester. It would be computed only when a candidate passes all the papers and obtains at least grade "P". It is calculated by dividing the total credit points earned by a candidate in all the courses by total member of credits assigned to the paper/course in a semester. It is expected up to two decimal places.

SGPA (Si)=  $\Sigma$  (Ci x Gi)/  $\Sigma$ Ci

Where Ci is the number of credits of the ith course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course.

(v) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a Student over all semester. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in the courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is given up to two decimal places.

CGPA=  $\Sigma$  (Ci x Si)/  $\Sigma$ Ci

Where Si is the SGPA of the ith Semester and Ci is the total number of credits in the Semester.

#### (B) ASSIGNMENT OF CREDIT

Every subject/paper of 100 marks shall have 4 credits.
