As proposed by the UG B.O.S in Political Science, C.U., the following guidelines are provided for the benefit of the teachers teaching the revised syllabus in Political Science.

The guidelines contain indicative points

Paper I

What is political: No univocal meaning— defined variously as science and interpretation. 'Common thread': management, if not resolution, of conflicts through institutions and practices. Structure-Agency approach and Process approach. (The following reference is useful: E.F. Miller, "What Does ""Political" Mean?", *The Review of Politics*, 42:1, January, 1980, pp. 56-72). A brief exposition of the transition from state-centrism to 'state and beyond' may be made to facilitate understanding.

Key political concepts:

State--- Definition, evolution. Nature: Idealist view; Liberal view; Authoritarian view; Post-Liberal view. Nation--- definition; elements of nationhood; International, post-national dimensions.

Rights--- Definition, nature, theories of rights. Justice--- definition, nature. Freedom--- definition, nature (including evolution). Democracy--- definition, types, nature (Liberal, Socialist, Social).

Citizenship---Evolution, basic components/dimensions of political citizenship (Rights, membership and participation), theories (liberal, communitarian, republican), dilemmas (universal versus differentiated; Gendered citizenship), - citizenship in postnational, globalized world.
