Pritam

# Concept Note

Kaifi Azmi, Subhash Mukhopadhyay and Amrita Pritam, started writing in three different languages at the conjuncture of modernity in the first half of 20<sup>th</sup> century. During 1930s, remarkable changes in Indian literature were observed with the reception of progressive ideas and with the participation of literary personalities as active members in the Progressive Movement in different languages. Progressive ideologies in Indian writing brought a paradigm shift in the idea of modernity in Indian literature. The women authors too were active participants in this shifting paradigm modern Indian literature. The literature produced through this approach did not only portray multiple layers of domination existed in domestic or socio-economic lives of the people but they also called to break the prison (that) existed in different spheres.

These authors successfully addressed the issues of their times with such a language which can be considered as alternative contributions to the literary convention. These progressive authors brought the issues of the local and the international together and extended the domestic reality into the world. They also popularised the intellectual, represented resistance as aesthetics, and turned the mundane into poetic.

This seminar seeks to celebrate the birth centenary of Azmi, Mukhopadhyay and Pritam by remembering them, and also by re-contextualizing their contributions to the contemporary understanding of Indian Literature as well as Comparative Literature in India. Through the literary contributions of Kaifi Azmi, Subhash Mukhopadhyay and Amrita Pritam, especially the literary themes and elements of literary language, we also would like to comprehend the paradigm shift in literary modernity.

## Call for Papers

The Department of Comparative Indian Language and Literature, University of Calcutta invites papers from students, research scholars, independent scholars and faculty members on the subthemes or any topics relevant to the theme of the seminar mentioned below.

Abstracts (within 300 words) should be submitted on or before 31th December 2018 to <u>cillacademic@caluniv.ac.in</u> with subject title "Abstract for Celebrating Centenary". The information regarding selection of the abstract will be intimated by 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2019.

The selected participants are required to submit their full papers (within 2500-3000 words) for 15 minutes presentation followed by 5 minutes discussion for circulation by 20th January, 2019.

The papers are to be written either in English or in Bangla. The papers in English should be written in MS word 12 point font in Times New Roman or Garamond font with 1.5 line spacing. The papers must follow MLA 7<sup>th</sup> edition style sheet. The papers written in Bangla must be typed in Avro-Kalpurush font in 12 point with 1.5 line-spacing. Authors writing in Bangla may follow Banga-bidya style sheet or any other standard style sheet. The selected papers are likely to be published.

Account details will be sent to the selected paper presenters through email. **No spot registration is permitted.** Registration fees include entry to all the academic sessions, seminar kits, working lunch, tea and snacks and seminar certificate.

A limited number of travel bursaries may be available if fund permits. Accommodation will be arranged for the out-station participants (paper presenters only) by the organisers. Preference will be given to the students, research scholars and independent researchers for the abovementioned opportunities.
